CIAO: Columbia international affairs online contains:

- full text documents for researchers of international relations
- working papers, policy briefs, journal articles, conference papers, e-books
- latest research of universities, independent research institutes, think tanks
- Economist Intelligence Unit background data for 201 countries.

Use CIAO: Columbia international affairs online to find:

- research on arms control, conflict resolution, defence, development, diplomacy, foreign policy, gender issues, globalization, human rights, international law, science & technology, security, terrorism
- research on individual countries, regions and international organisations
- case studies on important historical events
- course packs which present students with opposing views on a range of topics
- current working papers of research institutes updated monthly
- information from 1991.

Tips:

- Advanced searching enables more complex searches.
- Choose “the phrase” scroll box for words you want to appear next to each other.
- Advanced searching allows the choice of searching a region as well as subjects.
- Use (*) for wildcard searching, for example “disarm*” will search for disarmament, disarmaments, disarmed, disarming etc.
