Newsbank newspapers contains:

- complete full-text content of more than 100 Australian local, regional, and national newspapers
- The Age and the Herald Sun from 1999 to the present
- 90 international titles including 11 from the United States.

Use Newsbank newspapers to find:

- Australian and international news
- Community events, schools, politics, government policies, cultural activities, local companies, state industries, and people in the community
- Current events special reports and hot topics overviews

Tips:

- Browsing by date is available.
- Paid advertisements are excluded.
- News stories are arranged by newspaper section if you are browsing a particular issue.
- There are no images.
- For more accurate search results change default search from **All-text** to **Lead and first paragraph**.

Look for similar information in:

- Factiva, which has longer backfiles and a larger range of international newspapers.
