The Cochrane Library contains:

a collection of evidence based medicine databases including:

- Cochrane Central Register of Controlled Trials (Clinical trials)
- Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews (Cochrane reviews)
- Cochrane Methodology Register (Methods studies)
- Database of Abstracts of Reviews of Effects (Other reviews)
- Health Technology Assessment Database (Technology assessments)
- NHS Economic Evaluation Database (Economic evaluations).

Use the Cochrane Library to find:

- critical commentaries of articles and systematic reviews
- reports of controlled trials
- systematic reviews of the effectiveness of healthcare interventions
- studies about the methods used in systematic reviews
- studies of the medical, social, ethical and economic implications of healthcare interventions.

Tips:

- Help guides and tutorials are available via the Help link at the top of the screen.
- Search the databases simultaneously or limit your search to a specific database.
- Cochrane Reviews can be browsed by topic or review group.
- Use Advanced Search to combine multiple search terms.
- Use MeSH Search to map your search terms to Medical Subject Headings.
- For a comprehensive search, a combination of keyword and subject searching is recommended.
- Go to Search History to combine searches or apply limits.
- About Cochrane provides information about the Cochrane collaboration and specific Cochrane groups.
- References can be imported into EndNote using the Cochrane Library EndNote filter.
