VicMap topographic contains:

- topographic maps of the entire state of Victoria
- maps available in A3 and A4 pdf format
- 1:30,000 scale
- maps updated using most up-to-date data from VicMap.

Use VicMap topographic to find:

- maps of places in Victoria
- natural features in Victoria
- constructed features in Victoria
- roads in Victoria.

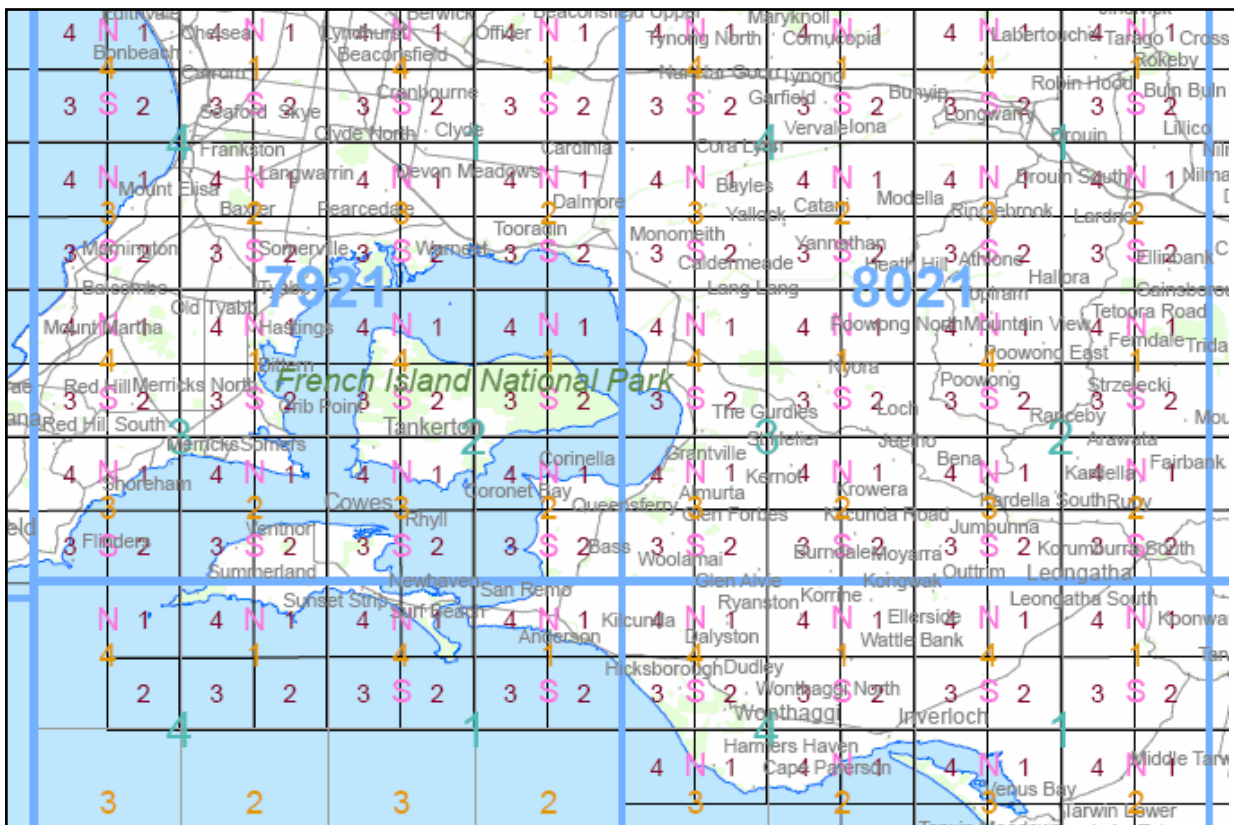
Tips:

- No access is provided off-campus.
- VicMap requires Acrobat Reader 7 or later.
- Use the **pdf index** to locate the appropriate map then select that number from either the A4 or A3 list of files.
- Increase the image percentage of the index to 3-400 % for best reading.
- Maps have either 7 numbers for A4 or 6 numbers for A3, which you construct from the index.
- The numbers are hierarchical. There is a **base number** which is the largest followed by numbers in descending size. In addition to size, numbers are colour coded in the order of blue, light blue, brown, and maroon. For A3 maps the number is followed by either an **N** or **S** representing north and south, eg. T7922-3-2N is the map reference for Clayton. Please see over the page for example of index.
